- 1. All applicants must complete and submit this supplementary application form with their application for admission to the Master of Human Rights and Democratisation (Asia Pacific) (MHRD).
- 2. All applications <u>must</u> include <u>all</u> required supporting documentation to be considered for admission to the degree and/or an MHRD scholarship.
- 3. Applicants seeking financial assistance should note only a <u>partial</u> scholarship is offered. The MHRD scholarship is not intended to cover the entire cost of living expenses or travel over students' twelve months of study.
- 4. To be shortlisted for an MHRD scholarship, applicants must:
 - Have received an unconditional offer of admission to a Master degree in the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences from the University of Sydney AND
 - Have provided proof of 6.5 IELTS overall and a minimum result of 6 in each band or equivalent, if they are from a non-English speaking background by 31 December 2013.
